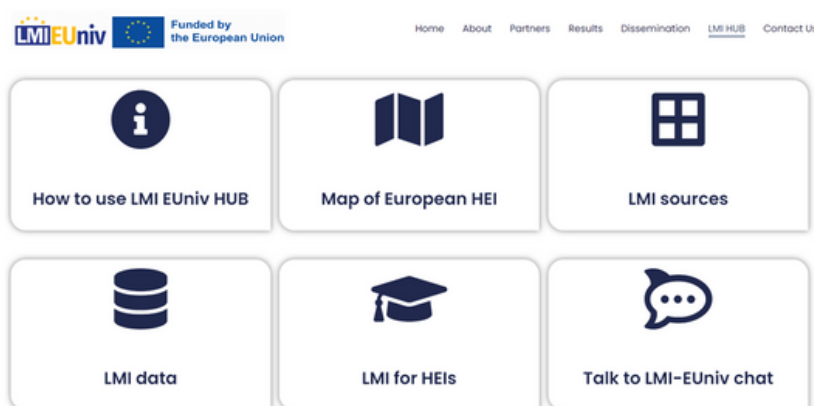

The EN RLMM focuses on innovative approaches for the monitoring of labour markets in regions and localities across Europe, and was therefore very interested on the LMI-EUniv project. The European Network seeks to further the concepts and instruments in regional and local labour market monitoring and to diffuse the common methods for research and analysis in this field.

The conference was organised jointly by the Economic Development Agency Brandenburg (WFBB) in Potsdam (Germany) and the Coordination/Management of the EN RLMM at IWAK from the Goethe University of Frankfurt am Main (Germany) in partnership with the OECD LEED-Programme.
